A: A mod is simply software that is installed in the game files themselves. A mod is a "modification to the game's source code". In this case, the goal of a mod is to "extend the functionality of the game". A mod usually does this by changing the source code. In-game mods are there to make the game even better. A good example of an in-game mod is the "Horses mod" which, among other things, allows you to have multiple horses and much faster travel times. The term "mod" was created before the modding community, which is a community of people who create and share mods. Most mods are created using the Game Maker Engine, which is also known as Game Maker Studio. All mods are created with the intention of being updated, some with the intention of never being updated, some with the intention of being updated periodically (mostly so that we can get bug reports).
